PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #1

Referee: Mark Halsey

Bet: 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points'

Strike rate: 93%

Referee Mark Halsey was an absolute banker for 'low Bookings' bets last season. He took charge of 27 Premier League games in 2008/9 – and in an incredible 25 of them, he dished out less than 4 yellow cards.

That's a 93% strike rate for bets on 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points' – 27 bets and 25 winners!

General odds: 10/11

Season profit from £10 stakes: £207.27

Return on Investment (ROI): 77%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

24th May 2009

Sunderland 2 Chelsea 3

Referee: M.Halsey

Cards = 2 yellows / Booking Points = 20 pts.

How to profit...

Bookies offer 'Over and Under' bets on how many 'Cards' or 'Booking Points' there will be in a game, in total.

Most bookies use this simple 'Booking Points' system for bets on yellow and red cards: a yellow card counts as 10 points and a red card is worth 25 points. The most one player can get in a game is 35 points (for 2 yellow cards resulting in a red).

Other bookies use a 'Cards' system, where a yellow counts as 1 Card and a Red is worth 2 (with 3 Cards being the most one player can get in a game).

In the example above there were 2 yellow cards – 20 points – so bets on 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points' paid out as winners.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #2

Team: Arsenal

Bet: '-2 Corner Handicap'

Strike rate: 84%

Arsenal won the most corners in 17 of their 19 home games (89% of games). On average, they won over 5 corners per game more than opponents at the Emirates Stadium.

Week after week, Arsenal racked up more corner kicks than the visiting team – landing bets on them with a '-2 Corner Handicap' in an impressive 84% of games.

That's 19 bets and 16 winners!

General odds: Evens

Season profit from £10 stakes: £130

Return on Investment (ROI): 68%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

24th May 2009

Arsenal 4 Stoke 1

Corners = Arsenal 6, Stoke 0.

How to profit...

Bookies offer two types of 'Corner Handicap' bets – the team expected to win the most corners is given a 'minus' handicap to beat, and the other team is given a 'plus' handicap to add to their score.

For example, Arsenal '-2 Corner Handicap' wins if Arsenal win over 2 corners more than their opponent.

In the example above, Arsenal won 6 corners more than Stoke – take off their handicap of -2 corners and Arsenal still have the most corners (4-0) – so the bet wins.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #3

Team: Man City

Bet: 'First Team to Score'

Strike rate: 89%

Man City scored the First Goal in 17 of their 19 home games last season - 89% of games. They went on to win 13 of those games.

That 'First Team to Score' bet was the most consistent and profitable bet you could've placed on Man City last season – paying out a winner in all but 2 of their 19 games at the City of Manchester Stadium.

In fact, the only home games in which City didn't score first were the only games where they failed to find the back of the net at all – 1-0 defeats to Man Utd and Everton.

That's 19 bets and 17 winners!

General odds: 5/6

Season profit from £10 stakes: £121.67

Return on Investment (ROI): 64%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

24th May 2009

Man City 1 Bolton 0

First Goal = F.Caicedo, 8 mins (Man City).

How to profit...

'First Team to Score' bets have three possible outcomes – the home team scores first, the away team scores first or no goals are scored.

In the example above, Man City scored the first (and only) goal of the game – so the bets wins.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #4

Team: Fulham

Bet: 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points'

Strike rate: 84%

Fulham were the best-behaved team in the Premier League last season, with 79% of all games seeing less than 4 yellow cards shown in total. This was a trend that paid out time and time again throughout the season.

Their away form was particularly impressive, averaging just 17.6 'Booking Points' per game – that's less than 2 yellow cards in total per game.

Bets on Fulham away games being 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points' paid out a winner in 16 out of 19 games – an 84% winning strike rate.

That's 19 bets and 16 winners!

General odds: 10/11

Season profit from £10 stakes: £115.46

Return on Investment (ROI): 61%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

2nd May 2009

Chelsea 3 Fulham 1

Cards = 1 yellow / Booking Points = 10 pts.

How to profit...

Bookies offer 'Over and Under' bets on how many 'Cards' or 'Booking Points' there will be in a game, in total.

Most bookies use this simple 'Booking Points' system for bets on yellow and red cards: a yellow card counts as 10 points and a red card is worth 25 points. The most one player can get in a game is 35 points (for 2 yellow cards resulting in a red).

Other bookies use a 'Cards' system, where a yellow counts as 1 Card and a Red is worth 2 (with 3 Cards being the most one player can get in a game).

In the example above there was just 1 yellow card – 10 points – in the game, and 'Under' bets paid out as winners.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #5

Team: Man Utd

Bet: 'To Keep a Clean Sheet'

Strike rate: 68%

Man Utd kept more 'Clean Sheets' than any other team in the Premier League last season, preventing their opponents from scoring in 63% of all games.

They showed their best form at home – winning 16 out of 19 games at Old Trafford (the best 'home win' record in the Premier League), scoring more goals than anyone else (43 'Goals For') and keeping 13 'Clean Sheets.'

Bets on Man Utd 'To Keep a Clean Sheet' paid out in 68% of their home games.

That's 19 bets and 13 winners – all available at much better odds than simply backing the Champions at odds-on to win their home games.

General odds: Evens

Season profit from £10 stakes: £70

Return on Investment (ROI): 37%

Compare that to an ROI of 18% and profit of £34 from backing Man Utd at 2/5 to win every home game.

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

16th May 2009

Man Utd 0 Arsenal 0

How to profit...

'To Keep a Clean Sheet' bets win if the team you have backed don't concede any goals in the game. In the example above, Man Utd drew 0-0 with Arsenal – and the 'Clean Sheet' bet paid out a winner.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #6

Team: Liverpool

Bet: '-2 Corner Handicap'

Strike rate: 74%

Liverpool have been one of the most reliable 'corner winners' in the Premier League for years now. Last season they averaged 8.8 'Corners For' per home game – which is almost 3 corners more than the Premier League average.

Our stats show they won almost 6 corners per game more than opponents – the best 'corners won margin' in the Premier League.

In 2008/9 Liverpool won the most corners in a table-topping 84% of games at Anfield. They won at least 3 corners more than opponents in 14 out of 19 home games – a 74% strike rate for bets on Liverpool with a '-2 Corner Handicap.'

That's 19 bets and 14 winners. In fact, last season you'd have landed more winners, at better odds - and made more money – backing Liverpool in the 'Corner Handicap' market than by backing them to win their home games.

General odds: Evens

Season profit from £10 stakes: £90

Return on Investment (ROI): 47%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

24th May 2009

Liverpool 3 Tottenham 1

Corners = Liverpool 9 Tottenham 2.

How to profit...

Bookies offer two types of 'Corner Handicap' bets – the team expected to win the most corners is given a 'minus' handicap to beat, and the other team is given a 'plus' handicap to add to their score.

For example, Liverpool '-2 Corner Handicap' wins if Liverpool win over 2 corners more than their opponent.

In the example above, Liverpool won 7 corners more than Tottenham – take off their handicap of -2 corners and Liverpool still have the most corners (7-2) – so the bet wins.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #7

Team: Chelsea

Bet: 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points'

Strike rate: 76%

Chelsea were a consistently 'clean' team last season – both home and away.

Their home games averaged 29.6 total 'Booking Points' per game, with away games coming in at 31.9 points. Making Chelsea a very reliable bet in the 'Cards' and 'Booking Points' markets...

Bets on 'Under 3.5 Cards' or 'Under 35.5 Booking Points' paid out a winner in 76% of all Chelsea games.

That's 38 bets and 29 winners – a very strong season-long trend.

General odds: 10/11

Season profit from £10 stakes: £173.64

Return on Investment (ROI): 46%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

24th May 2009

Sunderland 2 Chelsea 3

Cards = 2 yellows / Booking Points = 20 pts.

How to profit...

Bookies offer 'Over and Under' bets on how many 'Cards' or 'Booking Points' there will be in a game, in total.

Most bookies use this simple 'Booking Points' system for bets on yellow and red cards: a yellow card counts as 10 points and a red card is worth 25 points. The most one player can get in a game is 35 points (for 2 yellow cards resulting in a red).

Other bookies use a 'Cards' system, where a yellow counts as 1 Card and a Red is worth 2 (with 3 Cards being the most one player can get in a game).

Bet: 'Over 10.5 Corners'

Strike rate: 74%

Aston Villa games featured some of the highest corners totals in the league last season. For example, there were an incredible 23 corners in their game against West Ham in April – and the Premier League average is 11!

And that was no fluke...

Villa games paid out on 'high Corners' bets all season long, both home and away. And their season average was over 13 total corners per game.

Bets on 'Over 10.5 Corners' paid out in 74% of all Aston Villa games last season.

That's 38 bets and 28 winners – a corners 'cash cow' that paid out consistently in 2008/9.

General odds: 5/6

Season profit from £10 stakes: £133.33

Return on Investment (ROI): 35%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

16th May 2009

Middlesbrough 1 Aston Villa 1

Total Corners = 15

How to profit...

Bookies offer 'Over and Under' bets on how many Corners there will be in a game, in total.

In the example above, there were 15 corners in the game – so bets on 'Over 11.5 Corners' paid out a winner.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #9

Team: Sunderland

Bet: Opponents to get the 'First Card'

Strike rate: 74%

Sunderland did a good job of getting off on the right foot with Referees last season – it was their opponents who were shown the 'First Card' most of the time!

In 19 home games, a Sunderland player was first in the Ref's book on just 4 occasions. One game had no cards – and the other 14 all saw the away team pick up the 'First Card.'

That's a 74% strike rate for 'First Card' bets on Sunderland's opponents at the Stadium of Light – 14 out of 19 winning bets.

General odds: Evens

Season profit from £10 stakes: £90

Return on Investment (ROI): 47%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

24th May 2009

Sunderland 2 Chelsea 3

First Card = A.Cole, 34 mins (Chelsea).

How to profit...

'First Card' bets have three possible outcomes – the home team gets the First Card, the away team gets it or there are no cards shown at all.

In the example above, Chelsea's Ashley Cole was the first player in the game to be shown a card – so the bet on the away team getting the First Card was a winner.

PREMIER LEAGUE MONEYMAKER #10

Team: Stoke City

Bet: 'Time of First Goal – After 27th Minute'

Strike rate: 74%

Stoke had one of the highest 'Under 2.5 Goals' records in the Premier League last season – 74% of their home games had 2 or less goals in them. That 'low Goals' stat goes hand-in-hand with another lucrative Goals trend on show at the Britannia Stadium...

The average 'Time of First Goal' at Stoke last season was '50 minutes.' And considering the bookies let you bet on the First Goal coming 'Before of After' the 27th minute, that's a stat well worth knowing!

The 'Time of First Goal' was 'After' the 27th minute in 74% of Stoke's home game last season. That's 19 bets and 14 winners.

General odds: Evens

Season profit from £10 stakes: £90

Return on Investment (ROI): 47%

Last payout in 2008/9 season:

16th May 2009

Stoke 2 Wigan 0

Time of First Goal = 69 mins, R.Fuller (Stoke).

How to profit...

Bookies offer 'Before and After' bets on the 'Time of First Goal,' usually around the 27-minute mark.

In the example above, the First Goal was scored in the 69th minute – so the bet on 'After the 27th Minute' pays out a winner.

Pssst! Check out this top 12/1 'Correct Score' trend...

Here's one more Premier League moneymaker for you...

Last season Fulham set a record for 0-0 draws in the Premier League – they drew an unprecedented 7 away games with a blank scoreline.

That's 7 of the same 0-0 'Correct Scores' out of 19 away games – a bet that pays out at odds of 12/1!

And this trend is no fluke – Fulham were involved in more goalless games than anyone else because of the way they play...

Take a look at some of the teams those results came against – Fulham held out for 0-0 draws at high-flyers Liverpool and Arsenal, and struggled to break the deadlock against fellow 'low Goals' merchants Stoke and Wigan.

General odds: 12/1

Season profit from £10 stakes: £720

Return on Investment (ROI): 379%

A £10 bet on the 0-0 draw in all Fulham's away games last season would've given you a whopping £720 profit!

That's a staggering Return on Investment of 379% .
